
The NCJFCJ has a total of seven organizational members: the Florida Coalition for Children, PACE Center for Girls, National CASA Association, Communities in Schools, Assist Education/Advantages Schools International, PACE Youth Programs, and Oregon Youth Development Council (newest organizational member), and Georgetown Law is a Law School Member.

In January 2019, the Bylaws revision to the Law School Membership was adopted and allows a free student membership to students at law schools who join as Law School members of the NCJFCJ.
