

E. Special Standing Committees. These are permanent committees which serve the Council and which have special criteria delineated in these Bylaws.

6) State-Tribal Partnerships Committee. There shall be established a State-Tribal Partnerships Committee each year with the following mission:

- to develop relationships and collaboration with other State-Tribal judicial organizations that share similar missions and goals as the NCJFCJ;
- to develop relationships to further State and Tribal efforts to improve practice and collaboration;
- to work with other NCJFCJ Committees to identify overlapping issues and to collaborate on problem-solving solutions; and
- to assist the NCJFCJ in reviewing and monitoring its policy statements, resolutions, and initiatives for relevance, and identify issues that should be addressed.

a. The President, in consultation with the other members of the Executive Committee, shall appoint members to the State-Tribal Partnerships Committee each year.

b. Appointees must hold active dual membership with the NCJFCJ and NAICJA and be in good standing.

c. The Committee shall meet regularly by conference call or other electronic means, and in person as circumstances may allow.

d. The State-Tribal Partnerships Committee shall operate in accordance with a Charter that is approved by the Board of Directors.

e. The State-Tribal Partnerships Committee shall provide a written report on its work to the Board for every regularly scheduled Board meeting.

E. Special Standing Committees. These are permanent committees which serve the Council and which have special criteria delineated in these Bylaws.

7) Court Management Committee. There shall be established a Court Management Committee each year with the following mission:

- to develop relationships and connections between court administration professionals and judicial officers, both in local court systems and in national organizations;
- to serve as a forum to explore strategies in the arena of collaborative efforts between judicial officers and court administration professionals; and
- to invest in and develop methods to share this information and provide educational presentations, curriculum, and training opportunities about best practices with court officials from across the country.

a. The President, in consultation with the other members of the Executive Committee, shall appoint members to the Court Management Committee each year.

b. Appointees must hold active dual membership with the NCJFCJ and NACM and be in good standing.

c. The Committee shall meet regularly by conference call or other electronic means, and in person as circumstances may allow.

d. The Court Management Committee shall operate in accordance with a Charter that is approved by the Board of Directors.

e. The Court Management Committee shall provide a written report on its work to the Board for every regularly scheduled Board meeting.
