

## **2020-2021 State-Tribal Partnerships Committee Charge**

### **State-Tribal Partnerships Committee [Indirect]**

Description: The State-Tribal Partnerships Committee works to develop relationships and collaborate with other State-Tribal judicial organizations that share similar missions and goals as the NCJFCJ; these relationships further State and Tribal efforts to improve practice and collaboration; to assist the NCJFCJ in reviewing and monitoring its policy statements, resolutions, and initiatives for relevance; and to identify issues that should be addressed.

- A. Review and comment on resolutions, proposed legislation and publications as requested.
- B. Work with other NCJFCJ committees to identify overlapping issues, for example missing and murdered indigenous people, domestic violence, human trafficking, substance abuse, law enforcement and child welfare jurisdictional issues, and to collaborate on problem-solving approaches.
- C. Develop and submit presentations/topics that committee members would like to present/serve as speakers during the National Conference on Juvenile Justice and the Annual Conference.
- D. Assist the Board Committees by providing quotations and stories from state and tribal judges about their experiences with children, families, and victims who come before them to personalize the impact of the NCJFCJ's work; work to increase state engagement and increase membership recruitment and retention in both the NCJFCJ and NAICJA.
- E. Support the goals outlined in the NCJFCJ Strategic Plan.
